Original settlers planted their lives here 387 years ago to "worship God freely" and become a "city on a hill" for all of New England and the rest of the New World. Winthrop is a place that was prayed over 387 years ago and became known as "The Burned Over District" because of all the revivals that began here.

Much has changed since 1630. Full of young growing families, the city of Winthrop has no evangelical churches and no gospel witness. Our vision is to reach Winthrop with the gospel and be a catalyst to planting other life-giving churches.
