## About the Church Plant

We officially launched Mosaic Bible Fellowship on March 23, 2014, at the Manual Career Technical Center, located at 1215 E. Truman Road. The people whom we serve in this area are very needful of a good education and jobs. The average income per household is around \$20,000, and the dropout rate is 60 percent from grades 10-12, thus our partnership with this technical high school and the district is strategic and beneficial to the community.

Also fatherlessness is a big problem. About 70 percent of the homes in our impact area are fatherless. Therefore, one of the first small groups we initiated was a men's group.
