Joe and Patricia moved to the Buford and Sugar Hill area in the early '90s from Columbia, S.C. Joe began his ministry as an associate pastor of pastoral care and biblical guidance at Hebron Baptist Church where, in 2005, he was called into ministry. He studied at Columbia Bible College and was ordained in 2010.

Professionally, Joe is board certified in nuclear medicine technology and nuclear cardiology. He ministers to people physically and spiritually as a nuclear cardiology assistant.

Patricia started out singing in the choir at Hebron Baptist Church. She started helping her husband with the youth ministry. God gave her a desire to use her gifts and talents to expand the ministry. She began to lead praise and worship. The ministry began to grow tremendously, which inspired a dance group called "Genesis." Patricia is also a paraprofessional at Buford City Schools, working in special education for 12 years.

The Dunsons have four children and all are involved in the ministry.

About the Church Plant

Joe witnessed negligence and despair within communities in the Lawrenceville area. At-risk youth were attending church, but they were neither learning nor growing. He founded H.Y.P.E. (Helping Young People Excel), not only to teach young people about the love of God, but to allow them to praise and worship God in a way relevant to their culture. Because the young people knew dance, rap and spoken word, they were encouraged to express their worship in this manner.

H.Y.P.E. was birth from Hebron's bus ministry and is now called LifePointe. This ministry has served more than 300 youths, who came with a plethora of emotional, environmental and relational challenges. Gang members' lives have been changed through this ministry.
