About the Church Plant

Central Community Church seeks to bring the church back to the city. The core neighbourhoods where we are were once home to 50 of Edmonton's most vibrant and dynamic congregations. Some of their buildings still mark their legacy as architecture firms, theatres, Buddhist temples and elaborate private homes.

We believe God still loves middle-class families, the working poor, new immigrants from 78 countries and the homeless or marginally-housed who make up the more than 30,000 people who live in our target neighbourhoods. We exist to bring them the message of God's love for them in word and deed! We need seven new churches planted to meet all the needs. After starting in January 2014, we sent out our first church planter in October.
