Pastor Jan is also currently working on his ThM at Gordon-Conwell Theological Seminary.

About the Church Plant

Mosaic Boston was launched in fall 2011 in the basement of America's first YMCA. The core group of around 30 people has since grown to an average of 300 in attendance with two Sunday morning services at the Fenway Cinemas and a third service on Sunday evenings. On Sunday afternoons, lead pastor Jan Vezikov also leads a Russian-speaking congregation called Grace Church that serves Boston's large Slavic population. In 2013 Pastor Shane Sikkema joined the mission and now oversees Mosaic's community groups and worship teams.

Reflective of the city in which we live, Mosaic Boston is very diverse. Our community is made up of individuals from all over the world, speaking more than a dozen different languages.
