## About the Family

I am married with three children. David (27), Sara (25) and Andrew (20). The two youngest children are still in the house and very active in ministry. We have been planting churches now for 32 years on different continents. I planted more than 20 churches, and we have been in Montreal for 10 years. Our family works as a team, and we love serving God together.

Our previous church plants were in the Toronto area where we lived for 12 years and planted in multiple locations. Coming to Montreal was a challenge since we had to leave behind a successful family of churches and our friends. It is difficult to see church growth in Quebec, but God is blessing us with a team of talented leaders who are committed to ministry and to the vision of winning souls and making disciples. We cultivate "Passion for God, Passion for People, Passion for the Word, and Passion for our World." We have this motto as a family, and we share it with the church.

## About the Church Plant

The Passion Centre was planted in 2014 as a church for people who are not into church. We realized that most people in Montreal have a bad opinion of Christianity so we conceived a different type of space. Since the local laws do not allow zoning for new churches, I leased a unit in a strip mall on the busiest street of our area and opened a commercial space zoned as a convention centre. Passion Centre then rents space from the business, and we do business rentals in order to pay for this expensive unit.

We have morning services in English and in French and an evening gathering for millennials with an outreach approach. We are now at capacity and urgently need to expand to a bigger location.
